- 1876 1st game of baseball Avoca 36, Walnut 18.
- 1897 1st game of football Walnut 6, Avoca 0.
- 1900 1st high school baseball team.
- 1908 1st girls basketball game, versus Oakland. five players per side (2 forwards, 2 guards, 1 center confined to center cirle of court). Captains Jennie Cissna, Alma Johanssen.
- 1908 Walnut's football team defeats Harlan 10-6.
- 1917 Earl Caddock defeats Joe Stecher in Omaha for the world wrestling championship.
- 1920 Caddock's Colts, semi-pro baseball team, is organized.
- 1920 Earl Caddock loses to Stecher in a rematch in New York City's Madison Square Garden.
- 1921 The Colts defeat Manning, who had hired Claude "Lefty" Williams to pitch, he of the infamous Chicago Black Sox of the 1919 World Series. About 3,000 attend the game at Kent's Park.
- 1922 Walnut's high school baseball team participates in the Ames Invitational.
- 1928 Walnut's high school teams take the name "Cardinals"
- 1929 Walnut's HS girls basketball team wins the Pott County Championship, the first of 6 titles over the next 8 years.
- 1933 the boys basketball team wins their first -ever conference and county titles.
- 1933 Legion youth baseball begins with the "Juniors", ages 9-17.
- 1933 the Harlem Globetrotters appear in Walnut in a game against our town team.
- 1935 the town baseball team takes the name the Red Sox.
- 1935 Walnut fields a men's softball team for the first time, sponsored by Osler Chevrolet.
- 1939 our football team captures their first ever conference title, sharing the crown with Avoca and Oakland.
- 1941 our boys basketball team takes the Southwest Iowa Conference crown.
- 1945 The Community Club purchases six acres of land for a sports park from Emil Dau at \$500 per acre. It is named Veteran's Memorial Park, and becomes the home for baseball and football games.
- 1946 Harold Johnk, one of Walnut's best athletes to date, is named head basketball coach at Omaha University after starring as a player there. He would resign this position two years later to join his father on the family farm in Lincoln Twp.
- 1946 boys basketball wins the conference crown. They would repeat in 1948.
- 1946 Walnut's town baseball team is named the Blue Sox, for their new gray uniforms trimmed in blue, with gray cap and blue sox.
- 1946 Legion Post 422 fields their first "Midgets" team, a new classification for ages 9-14. Juniors become age 15-17.
- 1947 Eldon Bees pitches 3 consecutive complete game shutouts as Walnut wins the spring high school sectional baseball tournament. He strikes out 21 batters.
- 1948 Bill Kay (pronounced Kye), a 1942 graduate of WHS, signs a contract to play professional football with the New York Giants. He was a two-time All-American at Iowa University as a tackle, and named captain of the team in 1947.
- 1948 Lights are installed at Memorial Park, making it a highly sought-after venue for tournaments statewide.
- 1948 Walnut's town baseball team, the Cardinals, wins the western division of the lowa Western League. They lose to Earling in the finals in Walnut.
- 1949 The first American Legion District Seven Midget baseball tournament is held in Walnut. Walnut would host the event for 23 of the next 26 years. District Seven is composed of the 13 counties in the southwest corner of the state.
- 1950 Future baseball Hall-of-Famer Bob Gibson and his YMCA team from Omaha defeat the Walnut Midgets in Walnut 23-3. Walnut would go on to qualify for the district tournament that year.
- 1950 Legion Post 422 fields their first "Cubs" team, another new classification, for ages 9-10. Midgets remain 11-14.
- 1951 Walnut's boys basketball team wins the conference crown, going undefeated

- 1954 Our football team goes 7-2, the school's best record to date. Larry Koehrsen is named to the Des Moines Register's all-state team, WHS's first such honor.
- 1955 the high school baseball team wins the summer sectionals tournament, defeating Elk Horn.
- 1955 WHS fields a girls softball team for the first time.
- 1956 The WHS girls basketball team is crowned conference champions for the first time since 1939. They lose to Oakland in a close game in the district finals. Guard Mable Dorscher is named to the Des Moines Register's All-State First Team, Walnut's first girl all-stater and only first-teamer.
- 1957 The WHS girls basketball team is conference, sectional and district champion and qualifies for the state tournament, losing out to eventual champion Garrison in the first round. The tournament was played without divisions only 16 teams qualified for the tournament.
- 1957 Walnut's Midgets make it to the championship of the district 7 tournament in Legion baseball, losing to Casey in the finals.
- 1957 Our high school medley relay team qualifies for both the indoor and outdoor state tournaments, made up of David Drake, Bob Eslick, Max Bornholdt, and Larry Koos.
- 1957 Larry Koos is crowned state champion in the 440 yard dash, class C, at the state indoor meet in lowa City.
- 1958 Gene Young of Walnut is crowned Class C champion in the football throw at the Iowa High School State Track and Field meet.
- 1958 Carmen Cordes is named as an all-stater in basketball, 3rd team.
- 1960 WHS baseball team wins the summer sectionals tournament.
- 1962 Dale Peters places 3rd in the discus throw at the state tournament.
- 1962 WHS changes its name and mascot from Cardinals to Warriors.
- 1964 our two-mile relay team places 3rd at State: Gary Harris, Wes Petersen, Robert Andersen, Tom McIntosh
- 1965 The girls bball team wins the sectional tournament.
- 1970 Barb Davis ends her career at WHS with 1,955 points in girls basketball, 2nd only to Carmen Cordes 1955-
- 1958 (2,223 pts). She scored 66 in one game, and averaged 49.5 per game in the 69-70 season, good for 3rd in state that year.
- 1971 Walnut High School joins the new Western Iowa Conference for all sports and activities. The WIC is a combination of the previous Tri-County Conference and Southwest Iowa Conference. The new conference includes AvoHa, Carson-Macedonia, Elk Horn-Kimballton, Griswold, Iowa School for the Deaf, Missouri Valley, Oakland, Shelby-Tennant, Treynor, Tri-Center, Underwood, and Walnut.
- 1972 Walnut fields a high school wrestling team for the first time.
- 1974 the girls bball team wins the sectional tournament.
- 1976 WHS wrestler Mark Drake qualifies for the lowa High School State Tournament, Walnut's first state qualifier.
- 1977 Jim Blum places 3rd at the state wrestling tournament. Mark Drake places 6th.
- 1978 Jim Stuart, a freshman, qualifies for the state wrestling tournament.
- 1978 Larry Johnk qualifies for the state track meet in the high hurdles.
- 1979 Larry Johnk wins the state championship in the 120 yd high hurdles, in a time of 15.01 secs. He also places 7th in the low hurdles.
- 1979 Volleyball becomes a varsity sport at WHS.
- 1980 Larry Johnk wins the state championship in the 110 meter high hurdles, in a time of 15.30 secs.
- 1980 Jolene Shirley qualifies for state in the discus, becoming WHS' first girls' track & field qualifier
- 1980 The girls bball team wins the sectional tourney.
- 1981 Nancy Blum, senior forward at WHS, is named Captain of the Omaha World-Herald's All-Southwest Iowa basketball team.
- 1981 Jim Stuart qualifies again for the state wrestling tournament, placing 6th. Ron Hamilton also qualifies for state.

- 1981 Kevin Brix places 6th in the 1600 meter race at the state tournament, setting a new school record .
- 1983 Walnut high school joins the Rolling Hills Conference for all sports and activities, which matches it up with schools of the same size as opposed to the previous conference.
- 1983 Walnut's high school football team qualifies for the state tournament for the first time. The head coach is Earl Harberts. Deven Harberts is named 1st team all-state. The team had the only undefeated season in Walnut's history.
- 1983 Walnut's high school girls basketball team qualifies for the state tournament for the 2nd time in its history. They lose to Des Moines North-Tech in the first round. The head coach is Rod Hoegh. The Des Moines high school had enrollment of >2,000 students, while Walnut had 87.
- 1983 Holli Harberts is crowned champion of the high jump at the Iowa State Track & Field meet. Her jump of 5'9  $^{1/2}$ " is still fifth best all time (all classes). Harberts was named the Omaha World-Herald's Female Athlete of the Year for Southwest Iowa. She also won the high jump at the indoor meet that year.
- 1984 Land is purchased adjacent to Veteran's Memorial Park to put in a softball and little league field, and the project is completed by the end of the year.
- 1984 both the girls and boys basketball teams win the Rolling Hills Conference championships.
- 1989 Deven Harberts, a 1984 graduate of WHS, signs an undrafted free agent contract with the Minnesota Vikings of the National Football League after a successful college career playing for the Iowa Hawkeyes.
- 1990 The Walnut school board approves a football and track sharing agreement between Walnut and Elk Horn/Kimballton, to begin in the 1991 season. The team would go on to be known as the Walnut-EHK Knights. The sharing agreement for football is abandoned in 1998 when both schools field new 8-man football teams.
- 1992 Heather Schirm leads the state in rebounding, at 13.1 per game, and is the only Walnut player listed in the IGHSAU basketball history books to this day.
- 1993 The Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union switches girls basketball from a six-player to a five-player structure.
- 1993 The Walnut-EHK Knights qualify for the state tournament in football. Ron Hamilton is co-coach.
- 1993 Walnut's baseball team wins its second district title in as many years, and loses in the sub-state final. This is the last year that the state tournament takes only 4 teams.
- 1994 The Knights qualify once again for the state tournament in football. Ken Olsen sets a state record with a 99-yd punt return in a game vs Ar-We-Va. He is named 1st team all-state.
- 1995 Walnut's baseball team qualifies for the state tournament for the first time ever. The coaches are Bob Gross and Denny Book. Justin Gross is named a 1st team all-stater.
- 1997 Walnut's baseball team qualifies for the state tournament for the second time, losing to Southeast Warren-Liberty Center in the first round.
- 1998 Larry Dant of Walnut is drafted by the Chicago Cubs in the 21st round of the amateur baseball draft. He is our only professional baseball draftee.
- 1998 Walnut High School joins 6 other teams in western lowa to convert to 8-man football, a new format adopted by the IHSAA. Curtis Osborn is our first 8-man coach.
- 1999 Walnut senior Josh Abel hits 20 home runs for the season, easily a school record.
- 2000 WHS girls basketball team wins conference and district titles, and loses to Manning 58-53 in Regionals. Coach is Bob Gross.
- 2000 WHS boys basketball team qualifies for the state tournament, our first and only such appearance. Coach is Jon Peterson.
- 2001 WHS softball team wins the conference and district titles, defeating Ar-We-Va 9-2. They lose to Southeast Warren 1-0 (extra innings) in the Regional Finals.
- 2001 WHS girls basketball team once again win conference and district titles. They lose to Van Meter 68-63 in overtime in Regionals.
- 2002 WHS girls basketball wins their third straight conference title.

- 2003 Walnut's A Cubs (formerly Midgets) win the state Legion tournament in Walnut, Legion Post 422's only championship in its 70 year history. The coach is Larry Jacobsen, who coached Legion Ball for 22 years in Walnut.
- 2004 Walnut's football team qualifies for state in 8-player, and hosts the first-ever state tournament game in Walnut. They defeat Farragut 51-44 in Walnut on a desperation 50-yd throw for a touchdown as time expires. They lose to Adair-Casey 42-29 in the semi-finals in Adair. Coach is Ron Hamilton.
- 2004 Walnut's volleyball team wins the Rolling Hills Conference. Coach is Gwen Blum.
- 2004 Walnut qualifies for the state tournament in baseball, defeating West Harrison in the 1st round, and then losing to state champion Martensdale-St.Mary's 7-4.
- 2004 Tyler Blum of Walnut is crowned champion at 215 pounds at the state wrestling tournament. He is the son of Jim Blum, who placed 3rd in state in 1977. Walnut's boys wrestled for Atlantic that year. Tyler would qualify for state in 2003 and 2005 as well, placing 3rd in 2005.
- 2005 Walnut qualifies for the state tournament in baseball, losing to state champion Kee-Lansing 14-5 in the first round.
- 2005 Walnut's softball team wins the conference championship.
- 2005 Walnut's football team qualifies for the state tournament, losing to Essex 48-40 in the first round. Coach is Alan Sorensen.
- 2006 Walnut's volleyball team wins the district title.
- 2007 Walnut's football team qualifies for the state tournament, defeating Essex and losing to Stanton. Coach is Ron Hamilton.
- 2010 Walnut's third baseball field is built at Veteran's Memorial Park. It is designed as a little league and softball field, and is named Logan's Little Field, in memory of Logan Blum, son of Rick and Gwen Blum, who died of a car crash at the age of 20.
- 2012 Walnut competes in its last high school competition of any kind during the baseball districts at Woodbine, losing 10-1 to Logan-Magnolia. All sports would be played as part of a whole-grade sharing agreement with AHST for 2012-13.
- 2014 Walnut grad Mitch Osborn ('80) is inducted into the Iowa High School Athletic Association Hall of Fame. Through the 2019 season and 35 years of coaching basketball, Osborn ranks 4th in Iowa history with 689 wins, 18 state tournament appearances and 3 championships at Elk Horn-Kimballton, Pomeroy-Palmer and Harlan
